Project title: Road Safety Phase VII

Expected timing/ duration: January 2022 - December 2023

Objective and brief summary of the project:

In August 2021, UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres extended the mandate of the Special Envoy until end of 2023. The specific tasks of the Special Envoy will remain the same: (i) promoting a global partnership to support the design and implementation of strategies and activities to improve road safety and explore the opportunities to set up a UN Road Safety Trust Fund; (ii) advocating with governments, civil society and the private sector for the promotion of road safety, particularly in countries with a high level of road fatalities and injuries; (iii) participating in global and regional conferences and meetings on road safety; (iv) advocating for the accession to, and the more effective implementation of United Nations road safety legal instruments. The Secretariat to the Special Envoy, hosted by UNECE since 2015, has supported the participation of the Special Envoy in global and regional conferences and meetings on road safety, development of information and materials about the United Nations road safety legal instruments as well as providing technical assistance upon requests of the UN Member States. Phase VII will continue to coordinate regional and national workshops in developing countries (online platforms, if needed), to support the implementation of Global Plan for the Second Decade, to promote the accession to, and the improved implementation of the UN Road Safety legal agreements, and to mobilize political as a new decade begins towards 2030. In addition, Phase VII will support the efforts United Nations Road Safety Fund (UNRSTF) to raise awareness about its activities and to encourage financial contributions. The project will deliver the following activities:

- A1.1. Providing administrative, logistical and substantive support to the Special Envoy;
- A2.1. Organizing meetings and events aimed at raising awareness and mobilizing political commitment to road safety;
- A.2.2. Providing technical support including advisory missions and capacity-building activities to 15 requesting low- and middle-income member States on the accession to and implementation of UN road safety legal instruments;
- A3.1. Organizing three regional workshops to facilitate regional dialogue and potential agreement to accede to and implement the conventions;
- A4.1. Support the Special Envoy in his efforts to cultivate the diplomatic channels in Geneva and New York for in the context of the Friends Networks, including for promotion of the UNRSF and other global initiatives.

The donor has provided commitment through 2024 in view of the UN General Assembly in August 2020 (A/RES/74/299), which recommended that the function of the United Nations Secretary-General's Special Envoy for Road Safety to be extended another ten years to cover the period of the Second Decade of Action for Road Safety (2021-2030). Therefore, subject to further extension of the mandate of the Special Envoy for 2024 by the Secretary General, it is expected that the project will be extended accordingly.

Expected results of the project:

- EA1. The Secretariat of the Special Envoy for Road Safety is efficiently maintained and fully functional;
- EA2. Increased national capacities to prioritize road safety in national plans/strategies, including increased awareness about United Nations road safety legal instruments and road safety best practices, also in the context of gender, human rights, environment, and digital agendas;
- EA3. Increased commitment to accession and implementation of the UN Road Safety Conventions;
- EA4. Increased support for the United Nations Road Safety Fund.

Justification of project and its relationship to the programme of work:

This project directly contributes to the objective of Subprogramme 2 "Transport" "to advance a regionally and globally sustainable inland transport (road, rail, inland waterway and intermodality) system by making it safer, cleaner, more efficient and more affordable, both for freight transport and people's mobility" of the UNECE proposed programme budget for 2022.
