7. Description of project:

The objective of the project is to support the promotion and implementation of the Espoo Convention and its future Protocol on Strategic Environmental Assessment and to provide technical support to the activities under this Convention, particularly the countries in transition. A second objective is to enhance the development of laws and regulations on environmental impact assessment, in particular in a transboundary context, by Parties and non-Parties to strengthen the implementation of the Convention. Thirdly, training is envisaged through the elaboration of guidelines on issues of relevance to the provisions of the Convention.

8. Implementation of project:

In order to achieve the above objective, the following activities are envisaged:

- a. planning and implementation of the work-plan as decided by the Second Meeting of the Parties to the Espoo Convention(February 2001).
- b. Providing technical support to Parties, particularly to countries in transition, to promote and implement the Convention through Seminars and Workshops, including those Seminars and Workshops related to the Protocol.
- c. Facilitate and support the participation of experts from countries in transition and NGO's in meetings under the Convention and the Protocol.
- d. Strengthen the activities aimed at promoting the Convention in other regions through the convening of workshops.

OVERALL OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT

This includes measures to strengthen the visibility and awareness of the Convention, as well as measures to support the participation of key stakeholders, in particular from countries in transition and NGO's.

SUMMARY OF THE MAIN DUTIES

Under the direct supervision of the Secretary to the Convention and within the framework of the Environmental Policy and Sustainable Development Team, the incumbent will assist the Secretary to the Convention in:

- a) Supporting the preparation and servicing of meetings under the Convention and the Protocol;
- b) Planning and implementing a program of national and sub-regional seminars and workshops aimed at promoting awareness of the Convention and the Protocol;
- c) Providing practical, technical and legal advice to stakeholders concerning the implementation of the Convention and the Protocol;
- d) Expanding the range of information materials and means of publicity for the Convention; and
- e) Perform other related duties as assigned by the Secretary to the Convention.

<u>Field of study</u>: Advanced degree in law, economics, environment or similar subject. Specialization in the fields relevant to the Convention and/or the Protocol is desirable.
